
## Installing a scale

Install a scale if you did not install one when you installed your device. Your device contains step-by-step installation instructions for compatible scales.

1. Tap Settings.



- 2. Scroll to the Advanced Device Options section at the bottom of the Settings screen, then tap **Scale Installation Guides**.
- 3. To view all the available scales, swipe to the left on the screen.



- 4. Tap to select the appropriate scale, then tap **Continue**.
- 5. Follow the instructions on the screen. To advance to the next step, swipe the screen to the left.

## Installing an external scale

Use an external scale if you send large packages or parcels. External scales have a larger weight capacity for heavier items.

1. If you are using the scale that is located on top of the device, remove the scale by lifting it off.





2. Fix the blanking plate on the device where the scale was located.






#### 3. Tap Settings.



- 4. Scroll down and tap Scale Installation Guides.
- 5. Swipe to the left and select the scale you are installing.



- 6. Tap Continue.
- 7. Following the on-screen instructions. Swipe to the left and unbox the scale.
- 8. Position and level the scale. The scale has a level bubble under its lid. Ensure the bubble is within the circle of the level bubble by adjusting the round feet of the scale.
- 9. Connect the large end of the USB cable into the device. Connect the other end into the scale.
- 10. Tap Continue.
- 11. Tap Verify.
- 12. Tap Got It.
- 13. Tap Envelope Printing.
- 14. Tap Weight, then tap Scale.
- 15. Place the mail on the scale.
- 16. Tap Apply.


### Installing the printhead

You may need to install a new printhead when the existing printhead is producing poor print quality.


#### 1. Tap Settings.




- 2. Scroll down and tap Envelope Printer Maintenance.
- 3. Tap Install Printhead.
- 4. Lift the cover. The ink cartridge moves to the front position.
- 5. Flip the ink cartridge cover open.




6. Remove the ink cartridge.




7. Squeeze the two gray tabs on either side of the printhead.




8. While squeezing, lift and tilt the printhead to the right. The printhead should come up out of the device.




- 1. Grooves.
- 2. Peg.
- 3. Tab.
- 9. Unwrap the new printhead and remove the protective strip.






10. Squeeze the tabs and slide the printhead pegs into the lower set of grooves.


Warning: If you do not seat the printhead correctly it can damage the device.




- 1. Grooves.
- 2. Peg.
- 3. Tab.
- 11. Keep squeezing the tabs and push the printhead flush against the wall. Tabs will snap outward when placed correctly.



12. Install the ink cartridge and close the guard.



13. Close the cover. The ink cartridge moves back to the original position.



- 14. Tap **Done**.
- 15. Print a print test pattern to be sure that your printhead is working properly.

## Setting up a wired network connection

Use a network cable to connect your device to the Pitney Bowes Data Center.

#### Step 1: Plug in your network cable

Plug one end of your network cable to your device and the other end to an internet jack on the wall or a router.

#### Step 2: Choose the connection type

Select one of the two connection types supported for this device:

- DHCP
- Static IP

DHCP is the most common connection type. Choose DHCP if you are unsure which connection protocol to use or contact your IT department for advice.


#### **DHCP**

1. Tap Settings.



2. Tap Wired.

#### 3. Select DHCP.



- 4. Tap Connect.
- 5. If it does not connect, unplug the power cord.
- 6. Wait 30 seconds. The screen should turn off after 10 seconds.
- 7. Plug the power cord back in directly into a wall outlet.
- 8. Quickly tap and release the power button to turn the device back on.
- 9. Tap Settings.



- 10. Tap Wired (Ethernet).
- 11. Tap **DHCP**.
- 12. Tap Connect.


#### Static IP

1. Tap Settings.



2. Tap Wired.

#### 3. Select Static.



- 4. Contact your IT department to obtain the settings you will need to enter for your device. The values needed are:
  - IP Address
  - Netmask
  - Gateway
  - DNS Address.
- 5. Enter the settings you obtained in step 4 for the **IP Address**, **Netmask**, **Gateway**, and **DNS Address** in the corresponding fields.
- 6. Tap Connect.
- 7. If the device fails to connect, remove the network cable from the back of the device.
- 8. Tap Connect. Wait for the attempted connection to fail.
- 9. Plug the network cable back in.
- 10. Delete the values in the IP Address, Netmask, Gateway, and DNS Address fields.
- 11. Enter the IP Address, Netmask, Gateway, and DNS Address that you obtained in step 4.
- 12. Tap Connect.

## Setting up a wireless (Wi-Fi) network connection

You can connect your device with a wireless network connection.

1. Tap Settings.



- 2. Tap Wi-Fi in the Device & Network section.
- 3. Choose your Wi-Fi network from the list. Tap **Add Network** if your Wi-Fi network does not appear.
- 4. Enter your Wi-Fi password.
  - **Tip:** Use the show password option to make sure that you enter your password correctly.
- 5. Tap **Advanced Options** if your network requires advanced network settings such as a Static IP address:
  - To set up a Static IP address:
    - a. Select the IP Setting menu and choose Static.
    - b. Tap on the line and enter the value provided by your IT department.
    - c. Tap the > in the green circle.

## Connecting to a hidden Wi-Fi network


Add a network when you want to connect using Wi-Fi and your network is not present in the Wi-Fi list.

1. Tap Settings.




2. Tap **Wi-Fi** in the Device & Network section to see a list of available networks.

3. Tap Add Network at the top of the Wi-Fi screen.



- 4. For each of the following steps, please consult with your IT department to obtain the necessary information.
  - a. Tap the down arrow in the Security field and select the security method.



- b. Tap **Advanced Options** to enter a static IP or set up a proxy.
- 5. Tap Connect when done.

## Forgetting a Wi-Fi network


#### Forget a Wi-Fi network if:

- You do not want your device to automatically connect to that network or
- You need to resolve a wireless network issue.
- 1. Tap Settings.




2. Tap Wi-Fi in the Device & Network section.

3. Tap the network you want to forget. You can only forget a network if you've connected to it before.



The network details appear.



4. Tap **Forget** to forget the network connection.

## Checking your network connection

Use the Network Connection app to check that you have the necessary internet services to connect to the internet. The app helps diagnose network connection issues.

Your IT department may be blocking certain services. Only they will know if the necessary services are available on your network.

- 1. To open and run the network checking app:
  - Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Network Connection**.
- 2. The device then provides you with the results of the network check.
- 3. Tap **Close** twice to return to the Home screen.

If you are unable to connect to the internet, ask your IT department or internet provider to check the internet settings before you contact Pitney Bowes.

# Finding the MAC address for wired and wireless networks

The MAC address is the network identifier for the device. IT uses it to allow the device onto the network.

Your device contains two MAC addresses: One for wireless connections and one for wired connections.


#### Locating the MAC address for wireless connections

1. Tap Settings.



2. Tap Wi-Fi.

3. The MAC address appears above the list of wireless networks.




#### Locating the MAC address for wired connections

1. Tap Settings.



2. Tap Wired (Ethernet). The MAC address is present at the top of the screen.



#### If the MAC address does not appear, try these steps:

1. Tap Settings.



2. Scroll down to the Advanced Device Options section and tap **About This Device**.

3. Scroll down to the Base Network Info section to locate the MAC Address.

4. Tap Cancel to return to the Home screen.

## Setting up a Proxy server

A Proxy server is a computer that acts as a gateway between your local network, your device, and the internet. Proxy servers provide increased performance and security.

If your network requires a proxy server, you must contact your IT department or service provider to obtain the proxy server information to set up a proxy server.

#### Choose the connection type

Choose how you connect your device to set up a Proxy server:


- Setting up a Proxy server using a Wi-Fi network connection

#### Setting up a Proxy server using a Wi-Fi network connection

1. Tap Settings.



- 2. Tap Wi-Fi in the Device & Network section.
- 3. Select the network from the list.
- 4. Tap on the Advanced Options checkbox to select it.
- 5. Scroll down and tap the arrow next to Proxy, then select Manual.




- 6. Enter the IP address, HTTP or HTTPS proxy address of your proxy server in the **Proxy Hostname** field.
- 7. Enter the port number for the proxy server in the **Proxy Port** field.
- 8. (Optional) Enter any specific URLs or URL patterns (such as internal addresses) that you wish to bypass the proxy in the **Bypass** field.
- 9. If your Proxy Server requires authentication, select the **Need Authentication** check box. Additional fields appear.
  - a. Enter the Proxy username in the **Proxy Username** field. This may be case sensitive for some proxy servers.
  - b. Enter the Proxy password in the **Proxy Password** field. This is case sensitive for proxy servers.

#### Setting up a Proxy server using a wired network connection

1. Tap Settings.



- 2. Tap Wired (Ethernet) in the Device & Network section.
- 3. Select either DHCP or Static IP.
- 4. If you select DHCP, tap on the drop-down arrow next to Proxy Setting and select Manual.



- 5. Enter the IP address, HTTP or HTTPS proxy address of your proxy server in the **Proxy Hostname** field.
- 6. Enter the port number for the proxy server in the **Proxy Port** field.
- 7. (Optional) Enter any specific URLs or URL patterns (such as internal addresses) that you wish to bypass the proxy in the **Bypass** field.
- 8. If your Proxy Server requires authentication, select the **Need Authentication** check box. Additional fields appear.
  - a. Enter the Proxy username in the **Proxy Username** field. This may be case sensitive for some proxy servers.
  - b. Enter the Proxy password in the **Proxy Password** field. This is case sensitive for proxy servers.



## Using the scale when printing postage

Use the scale to weigh your mail and calculate the correct postage for you.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Weight.




- 3. Tap Scale.
- 4. Place the envelope on the scale. You must do this before the next step or else the **Apply** button remains inactive.
- 5. Tap Apply.
- 6. Tap Class.
- 7. Select Start Over to show the class options.
- 8. Tap the class you want.
- 9. Select special services, if required.
- 10. Tap **Apply**.
- 11. Place the envelope or envelopes on the feed deck. Depending on the SendPro C model you have, feed the envelopes manually or tap **Start** to feed the envelopes.
- 12. The scale retains the weight of the mail for approximately 70 seconds. Add another mailpiece to the scale if you want to override the weight.

## Entering the weight manually when printing postage

Enter the weight of a mailpiece when you know its weight and are not using the scale.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Weight.




- 3. Tap Manual.
- 4. Enter the kilograms and grams.
- 5. Tap Apply.
- 6. Tap Class.
- 7. Tap **Start Over** to see all the class options.
- 8. Select the class and any special services required.
- 9. Tap Apply.
- 10. Place the envelope or envelopes on the feed deck. Depending on the SendPro C model you have, feed the envelopes manually or tap **Start** to feed the envelopes.

## Zeroing the scale

Zero the scale to set the weight to zero.

Make sure there is nothing on the scale when you zero it.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Weight.



- 3. Tap **Scale** on the weighing method screen.
- 4. Tap Zero Scale.
- 5. Tap **Cancel** to return to the Envelope Printing app.

## Using Scale Stabilization


If your device is close to an air conditioning unit, fan, draughts or is not on a stable surface, use Scale Stabilization to help prevent weighing issues and provide more accurate readings.

1. Tap Settings.



2. Scroll down to the Advanced device Options section.

#### 3. Tap Scale Stabilization.




- 4. Tap Enhanced.
- 5. Tap the back arrow to return to the Home screen.

## Using Differential Weighing


You can use Differential Weighing to process mixed weight mail more efficiently. Your device calculates the correct weight and price as you remove each mailpiece from the scale.

For large envelopes or parcels, use Differential Weighing to print a tape every time you remove a mailpiece from the scale.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Weight.




#### 3. Tap Differential.



- 4. Tap Apply.
- 5. Place all the mail on the scale.
- 6. Tap Class.

- 7. Select **Start Over** to show the class options.
- 8. Tap the class you want.
- 9. Select special services, if required.
- 10. Tap Apply.
- 11. Remove a mailpiece from the scale. Place the mailpiece on the feed deck. Tap **Start**. The device then prints the postage. Alternatively, tap **Tape** to print a tape.
- 12. Continue removing mail from the scale until you reach the last mailpiece. When you remove the last mailpiece, the device asks you if you want to print postage for the last item removed. Tap **Yes** if the item is a mailpiece. Alternatively, tap **No**, **not a mailpiece**.



13. If necessary, insert the mailpiece into the device, then tap **Start**. Alternatively, tap **Tape**. The device then prints the postage.

## Editing the Differential Weighing threshold


To edit the minimum weight each mailpiece must weigh while using Differential Weighing, you can set the Differential Weighing Threshold.

You can set the threshold weight in multiples of 1 gram up to 250 grams. For example, 1 gram or 2 grams.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Settings.



- 3. Tap Differential Weighing.
- 4. Select the desired weight from the Threshold menu.



5. Tap the back arrow to return to the Envelope Printing app.

### What is Accounting

You can use the accounting feature to track the postage that departments or individuals within your organization use.

The accounting feature helps you to understand how your business spends its postage and identify cost-saving opportunities. You can charge postage back to departments or clients and report on postage expenditures.

The Envelope Printing app uses a multi-level account format. It is different from the Parcel Shipping Shipping Cost Accounts.

When you use Envelope Printing accounts to track your postage usage, use sub accounts and sub sub accounts to analyze your usage within an account.

How you create accounts depends on your needs. You can create accounts in single or multiple levels. For example, you can divide a top level department (account) into two additional sub sections (sub accounts and sub sub accounts).

The Envelope Printing accounting structure can have up to a three level hierarchy:

- account (top level of the hierarchy)
- sub account (next possible level of the hierarchy)
- sub sub account (last possible level of the hierarchy)

**Important:** Only the lowest level of the account hierarchy is chargeable. This means that the lowest level of the account has the transactions applied to them.

- Account with no sub accounts When you create an account with no sub accounts, you
  charge postage to that account. This is because the account does not have sub or sub sub
  accounts.
- Account with sub account or sub sub account When you create a sub account or sub sub account, you charge postage to the lowest level (the sub account or sub sub account).

#### Account hierarchy examples

#### Top level account

Engineering

#### Account with sub accounts

- Engineering; Sub account Software;
- Engineering; Sub account Hardware;

#### Account with sub sub accounts

- Engineering; Sub account Software; Sub sub account Graphics and Layout; Sub sub account
   Design
- Engineering; Sub account Hardware; Sub sub account Quality Approval; Sub sub account Testing

#### Adding an account

Add accounts to record Envelope Printing usage by department.


An account is created automatically for you during installation. The account is called General.

You can edit the name if you want to, providing you have not printed any post against it.

You can create more accounts if you would like to.

- 1. Tap Manage Accounts on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Create new account twice.
- 3. Enter the account name in the Enter account name field. Account names can be up to 75 characters long.

If the keyboard does not pop up, tap the line in the box.



4. Enter a unique code in the Code field to identify each account. Codes can be alphanumeric. Codes help you locate accounts more easily.

- 5. You can use the optional fields, such as:
  - **Description** Enter a description of the account up to 150 characters.
  - Password Tap Password to add a password for an account.
    - Passwords are case sensitive, can be alphanumeric, and must be four characters in length. If you do set a password, you need to enter it to print mail.
- 6. Ensure you set the status to active.
- 7. Tap **OK** to save. The name of the new account appears.
  - Tap Create New Account to create another account.
  - Tap Add a sub Account to this account to add a sub account to the account you just created.
  - Tap Continue if you do not need to create any more accounts.
- 8. Press the **back arrow** to return to the Home screen.

# Turning account passwords on or off for printing postage

You can protect each account from unauthorised access by turning account passwords on.

- 1. Tap Manage Accounts on the Home screen.
  - Tap Turn account passwords on if account passwords are off and you wish to turn them
  - Tap Turn account passwords off if account passwords are on and you wish to turn them
    off.
- 2. Tap **Yes**.
- 3. Tap **OK**.
- 4. Tap **Home** to return to the Home screen.

## Selecting an account

When accounting is enabled on your device, you must select an account before you can print postage.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Account.
- 3. Tap the account you wish to use for your mail.

**Tip**: You can then create a preset which you use to quickly select the same settings in the future.

### Editing an account

Edit an account when you want to change the account name, code, description, status or password.

**Important:** Once you charge postage to an account, you cannot change the account name or code.

- 1. Tap Manage Accounts on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Edit account.
- 3. Tap the account you want to edit.
- 4. Select OK.
- 5. Make your changes, such as edit the account name, code, description, status or password.
- 6. Tap **OK** to return to the Accounts screen.
- 7. Tap the back arrow to return to the Home screen.

#### Making an account inactive

Setting the account status to inactive prevents anyone from charging postage against it.

- 1. Tap Manage Accounts from the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Edit account.
- 3. Tap the account you want to make inactive.
- 4. Select OK.
- 5. Tap **Inactive**.
- 6. Tap **OK** to return to the Accounts screen.
- 7. Tap the back arrow to return to the Home screen.

#### Deleting an account

You can delete an account, sub account, or sub sub account through the Envelope Printing app.

If you apply postage to an account, you cannot delete the account. You can only make the account inactive.

- 1. Tap Manage Accounts.
- 2. Tap **Delete account**. The list of available accounts appears.
- 3. Tap the account you want to delete.
- 4. Tap **OK**.
- 5. Tap **Yes**, **delete account** to confirm.



## Checking the available funds for printing postage

Check your funds for printing postage on your device at any time.

#### Viewing the amount available in your device


- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. The **Postage Balance** shows the available funds in your device.



#### Viewing the amount available in your postage account at Pitney Bowes

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Postage Balance.
- 3. Tap Envelope Printer Settings.

4. The balance in your postage account appears.



## Refilling postage funds for printing postage

Refill your postage funds for printing postage as soon as you receive a message that your funds are low.

#### Before you begin

Check that your device is connecting to the internet.

• For wired network connections, you will see the following connection image in the toolbar:



• If you have a wireless connection, you will see the following connection image in the toolbar:



To refill postage:

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Postage Balance.
- 3. Tap Refill Postage.
- 4. Enter the postage refill amount.
- 5. Tap **back** to change the amount shown.



- 6. Tap Refill Mail Postage.
- 7. Tap View Receipt to view or print a receipt.
- 8. Tap **Done**. Your updated postage balance appears on the Envelope Printing app.

# Getting a Royal Mail refund for damaged or incorrectly printed mail

Once you print an impression, your device deducts the postage amount from the postage funds. This happens even if the printing is illegible. Therefore, it is important you select the correct value before printing postage.

For up-to-date refund guidelines, refer to the Royal Mail website.

To request a refund via Royal Mail:

- 1. Don't post the items.
- 2. Remove the contents and start again with a new envelope.
- 3. Send any unused franked envelope (the whole envelope) to:

BL4 9XX

- The affected mail must be at least £10 in total value.
- All the impressions must be clear and readable and made within six months of the franked date.
- You will receive a cheque refund for the value of the unused impressions minus a 15% administration fee.

#### Changing the default refill amount for printing postage

Change the default refill amount to store an amount you want to refill your device with.

You can set the default refill amount during installation or change it at later time.

There are two ways to change the default refill amount:

#### From the Home Screen:

1. Tap Settings.



- 2. Scroll down to the Envelope Printer Settings section.
- 3. Tap Postage Refills.
- 4. Tap the box under **Default refill amount**.
- 5. Tap the back key to remove the existing amount. You may need to tap the key multiple times to clear the amount.
- 6. Enter the new amount.
- 7. Tap **Apply**.
- 8. Tap the back arrow to return to the Home screen.

#### From Envelope Printing:

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** from the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Postage Balance.
- 3. Tap Envelope Printer Settings.
- 4. Tap the box under **Default refill amount**.
- 5. Tap the back key to remove the existing amount. You may need to tap the key multiple times to clear the amount.
- 6. Enter the new amount.
- 7. Tap **Apply**.
- 8. If necessary, tap the back arrow to return to the Envelope Printing app.

## Setting the low funds warning for printing postage

Set the low funds warning to warn you when your available funds for printing postage reaches a certain amount. Use this warning as a reminder to add more postage to your device.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Postage Balance.
- 3. Tap Envelope Printer Settings.
- 4. Tap Low postage threshold.
- 5. Tap **back** on the keypad to remove the existing amount.
- 6. Enter the new amount.
- 7. Tap Apply.
- 8. If necessary, tap the back arrow to return to the Envelope Printing app.

## Signing in to and out of the Parcel Shipping app

In order to create and print shipping labels you need to sign in to your shipping labels account. You can also prevent unauthorised printing of labels by signing out of your account when you are away from your device.

Please note that the shipping application for the SendPro C devices does not support Single Sign On for PitneyShip Pro users.

#### Signing in

Tap **Parcel Shipping** on the Home screen to sign in to the Parcel Shipping app. You need to enter a name and password.

#### Signing out

1. Tap the user profile icon in the upper right corner of the toolbar to sign out of shipping labels.



- 4. Enter the sender information.
- 5. Tap Save.

#### Editing the sender address for shipping labels

Edit a sender address by editing it in the shipping Address Book.

- 1. Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Shipping Address Book** to open the Shipping Address Book app.
- 2. Tap Recipients and select Senders.
- 3. Select the address you want to edit.
- 4. Tap the edit icon.
- 5. Make your edits then tap **Update**. The Address Book appears.

## Reprinting a shipping label

If a shipping label does not print correctly, you can print it again up to three times within 24 hours of its creation.

- 1. Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Shipping History** to open the Shipping History app.
- 2. All the shipping labels appear by date. The latest date appears first. The Date column shows the date you purchased the postage.
- 3. Find your label in the list.
- 4. Tap the label to open the details screen.
- 5. Tap Reprint Label.
- 6. Tap Reprint.

## Getting a refund for a shipping label

Void a shipping label to cancel it. The funds will be re-credited to your Purchase Power account.

You have up to fourteen days after you print the label to void it.

- 1. Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Shipping History** to open the Shipping History app.
- 2. All the shipping labels appear by date. The latest date appears first in the list.
- 3. Find your label in the list.
- 4. Tap the label to open the details screen.
- 5. Tap Void Label.
- 6. Tap the tick box to confirm you accept the terms and conditions.
- 7. Tap Continue.
- 8. Press back twice to return to the Parcel Shipping app.

## What are Shipping Cost Accounts

Use Shipping Cost Accounts to charge back costs for printing shipping labels. This help you keep track of how much each department is spending.

When you print a shipping label you can allocate a shipping cost account to that label.

Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Shipping Cost Accounts** to open the Shipping Cost Accounts app to view all your cost accounts.

## Turning cost accounts on or off for shipping labels

Enable shipping cost accounts to keep a record of how much you are spending on shipping labels.

- 1. Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Shipping Cost Accounts** to open the Shipping Cost Accounts app.
- 2. Tap the Preferences icon.



- 3. Tap the slider in the upper right so that it turns blue and displays **ON**.
  - Tap the tick box for **Require cost account for all shipments**. This makes your device allocate a shipping cost account to every shipping label.
- 4. Tap the slider in the upper right so that it turns grey to turn shipping cost accounts off.
- 5. Tap **Apply** to continue.

You must add at least one shipping cost account in order to use this feature.

## Adding a shipping label cost account

Add shipping Cost Accounts to record shipping label usage by department.

- Tap SendPro Apps on the Home screen, then tap Shipping Cost Accounts to open the Shipping Cost Accounts app.

- 9. Enter a four digit or four character password and then re-enter it in the Confirm Password field.
- 10. Tap Add Cost Account.

## Modifying a shipping label cost account

Modify a shipping cost account to activate or deactivate a cost account, set a default cost account, or modify the description.

You cannot delete an existing shipping cost account.

- 1. Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Shipping Cost Accounts** to open the Shipping Cost Accounts app.
- 2. Tap the **Edit** icon for the shipping cost account you want to modify.





You can prevent shipping labels printing over a certain amount by setting a transaction limit.

You must log in as an Administrator to use this feature.

## Using the Shipping Address Book

The Shipping Address Book app allows you to add, edit, and delete addresses for everyone you ship to. Once you add an address to the Shipping Address Book app, you can select it when you print shipping labels.

To open the Shipping Address Book:

Tap SendPro Apps on the Home screen, then tap Shipping Address Book.

## Adding new addresses to the Shipping Address Book

Once you add an address to the Shipping Address Book app, you can select it when you print shipping labels. The Address Book can hold up to 1000 addresses.

- 1. To open the Shipping Address Book:
  - Tap SendPro Apps on the Home screen, then tap Shipping Address Book.
- 2. Tap **Recipients** if the new address is a recipient. Alternatively, tap **Senders**.
- 3. Tap +.
- 4. Enter the address information.
- 5. Tap Continue or Save when done.

## Searching for an address in the Shipping Address Book

If you have a lot of contacts in your address book, you may need to use the search feature to find the one you want.

- 1. Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Shipping Address Book**.
- 2. Select either **Recipients** or **Senders**.
- 3. By default, All is selected. This means that the search will look for Name, company and email. To search by a different field, select the menu and select the field you wish to search.


- 4. If you are searching for an international country in the Shipping Address Book, you have to use the two character country code to locate the country. Examples are:




## Filling the moistener tank

Your device will need refills of E-Z Seal® in order to seal envelopes. Follow these steps to fill the moistener tank.

1. Check the level of sealing solution in the moistener tank by checking the sight window on the front of the feeder deck.



2. Open the feeder access cover to access the moistener bottle.



3. Remove the moistener bottle and place it with the cap up on a flat surface.

4. Unscrew the moistener bottle cap and fill it with Pitney Bowes sealing solution. Do not overfill the moistener bottle.



- 5. Screw the cap back on and place the bottle back in its original site (upside down in the device).
- 6. Close the feeder access cover.
- 7. If the tank is empty, allow 30 minutes for the moistener brush and wick to get completely wet.

## Sealing envelopes and printing postage

Use the moistener on your device to seal your envelopes before you print postage.

1. Check the level of sealing solution by checking the sight window on the front of the feeder deck.



- 2. Place the envelopes with the flap side facing down and the top edge against the rear wall.
- 3. Make sure that the seal/no seal lever is set to the seal position (all the way to the left).



4. Place the envelopes on the feed deck. Tap **Start** on the Envelope Printing app.

If the moistener tank is full and your envelopes do not seal correctly, clean or replace the moistener brush and wick.

## Sealing envelopes without printing postage

Use Seal Only mode to seal envelopes without printing anything.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap **Print Mode**. You may need to swipe up on the screen to see this option.
- 3. Swipe up on the Print Mode screen and tap Seal Only.
- 4. Tap Apply.
- 5. Load the envelopes onto the feeder with the flap side facing down and the top edge against the rear wall.
- 6. Tap **Seal Only** to continue.

## Avoiding envelope sealing issues

#### Prevent sealing issues by:

- Having enough sealant in the moistener tank.
- Placing the envelope correctly on the feed deck.
- Maintaining the wick or brush in the moistener.
- 1. Check the level of sealant in the moistener tank. Add more if required.



2. Slide the envelope flap under the edge of the feed deck when inserting an envelope. Otherwise, the moistener cannot wet the flap.






3. If the moistener tank is full, and your envelopes are still not sealing correctly, clean your moistener brush and wick.


## Cleaning the moistener brush and wick assembly

If the moistener tank is full and your envelopes are not sealing properly, clean the moistener brush and wick.


### 1. Open the feeder cover.




### 2. Remove the moistener bottle from the device.




3. Grasp the moistener brush assembly and depress the moistener release button.




The release button is located on the underside of the moistener assembly.




4. While continuing to press the release button, slide the moistener brush assembly straight out toward you.




5. Slowly and carefully pull the moistener tank (located under the moistener bottle) out toward you. This may contain EZ-Seal solution.




6. Separate the shield from the wick. Clean the wick in plain water and rinse thoroughly. Blot excess water from the wick.




7. Replace the wick and shield.



8. Remove the moistener brush by sliding it out of the moistener brush assembly.




You may need to exert some pressure to remove the brush.




9. Clean the brush by running it under plain water. Blot the excess water from the brush after rinsing it. Replace the brush if you cannot clean it thoroughly.


10. Slide the moistener tank back into the device, followed by the moistener brush assembly.

# Viewing and printing a postage refill receipt

View and print receipts of previous postage refills by using the Print Refill Receipt app.

- 1. Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Print Refill Receipt.
- 3. Tap Refill History.
- 4. Tap the receipt you want to view.
- 5. Tap **Print** to print a refill receipt.
- 6. Place an envelope on the feed deck. Depending on the SendPro C model you have, feed the envelope manually or tap **Start** to print the receipt.
- 7. Press X to close the screen.
- 8. Tap **Cancel** then **Close** to return to the Home screen.

# Viewing the total spent on printing postage

View the total amount you have spent on postage and the total number of pieces printed.

1. Tap Settings.



- 2. Scroll down to the Envelope Printer Settings section.
- 3. Tap Postage Refills.
- 4. Tap **Advanced** to view the total amount of postage spent and the number of pieces printed.

# Printing a Register report

Print a Register report if you need a report showing the total number of mailpieces sent.

The Register report provides the following information about your device:

- **Used**: The total amount used over the lifetime of the device.
- **Unused**: The amount currently available to print.
- Total Pieces: The total number of mailpieces run over the lifetime of the device.
- Control Sum: The control sum is the total of the amount used and unused.
- Batch Count: The current Batch Count.
- Batch Value: The current Batch Total.

- PBP Serial No: The serial number of the device.
- The date and time the report was printed.

#### To print a register report:

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap the piece count in the upper right.
- 3. Tap Print Report.
- 4. Tap SendPro C Envelope Printer.
- 5. Place the envelope on the feed deck. Depending on the SendPro C model you have, feed the envelope manually or tap **Start** to feed the envelope.
- 6. Tap the **back arrow** to return to the Envelope Printing app.

# Running postage printing account reports

Run account reports to show how you spent your postage for a specific account or for all accounts over various time periods.



The End date of the fiscal year is set based on the start date you enter. You cannot enter this date manually.

- 6. (Optional) Tap **Previous year** and **Next year** to view the reporting periods for the previous and next year. Tap **up** and **down** to scroll through the list of reporting periods for the current year.





- 10. Tap the file type you wish to send: **xlsx** (Excel), **csv** (comma-separated values), **pdf** (Portable Data Format).
- 11. Tap **Send**. The report appears from no-reply@pb.com.
- 12. Tap **OK** when **Email Sent** appears.
- 13. Tap the back arrow to return to the Home screen or **Cancel** twice to return to the Manage Accounts screen.

# Turning off Auto Receipt prompts

You can stop your device offering you a receipt after you print each Special Delivery or Signed For mailpiece.

# What are print modes

As well as printing postage, your device uses other ways to print and feed mail. Tap **Print Mode** in the Envelope Printing app to see the available options.

- Date and Time Stamp Print just the date and time. Your device will not print any postage.
- Graphic only Print a graphic. Your device will not charge you for printing a graphic only.
- Postage printing Postage printing is the default mode for printing mail.
- Seal only Seal your envelopes. Your device will not print when you select Seal Only.
- **Permit mode** Prints Postage Paid Impressions (PPI) to your mail. You must have a Permit ID which you obtain from Royal Mail.

# Printing a custom or standard graphic

Customise your mail by adding a custom logo or standard graphic.

#### **Uploading Custom graphics**


You can upload a graphic via Your Account. Sign in to the Pitney Bowes Your Account online portal.

#### **Downloading Custom Graphics**

Tap **SendPro Apps** on the Home screen, then tap **Rates and Updates**. Your graphic downloads will then be available for printing.

## Standard graphics


Your device has a set of standard graphic images that you can add when you print postage.




## Printing a custom or standard graphic

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Account, then select an account.

#### 3. Tap Weight.



- 4. Tap Scale.
- 5. Place the envelope on the scale. You must do this before the next step or else the **Apply** button remains inactive.
- 6. Tap Class then select the class of mail you want.
- 7. Tap Graphic.



- 8. Select the graphic you want from the list.
- 9. Tap **Apply**.
- 10. Place the envelope on the feed deck. Depending on the SendPro C model you have, feed the envelopes manually or tap **Start** to verify that the envelope prints correctly.

# Adding a return address or custom text message

Add a return address or custom text message to print a return address or to print your own personalised message. Your message must comply with Royal Mail rules.

#### Before you begin

Please follow these guidelines before creating your return address or custom text message:


- If you are creating a return address:
  - The text Return Address must be included as the first line of the return address. Do not include a colon after Return Address.
  - The return address must fit a maximum of five lines including the return address text. You can use up to twenty characters per line.
  - The return address should contain your business name, address number and road, town and postcode. Your county is not required. The first letter of each word should be upper case, except the postcode which is all upper case.





# Printing a Permit (PPI) impression

To print a Permit (PPI) impression you need a Permit ID which you obtain from Royal Mail.

You must add your Permit ID to your device before printing a PPI impression. Once you add the Permit ID you do not have to add it again.

**Important**: Depending on the permit selected, you may only be able to print certain graphics and custom text messages depending on your envelope or label size.

# Printing a graphic without printing postage

Print a graphic without printing postage, such as the Received graphic on incoming mail.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Print Mode.
- 3. Select Graphic Only.
- 4. Tap Apply.
- 5. Tap **Graphic**.
- 6. Select your graphic.
- 7. Confirm with **Apply**.
- 8. Print the graphic on the envelope or tape.

# Printing postage on tapes

If it is not possible to print postage directly onto your envelope, you can print it onto a tape. You can then apply the tape to the envelope.

1. Push the tape lever to the right and hold it there (a). Drop a stack of strip tapes down into the slot (b). Make sure that the printable side faces to the right (toward the touchscreen).




- 2. Tap Envelope Printing on the Home screen.
- 3. Select the postage mode and settings (account, class and special service, weight).
- 4. For a single tape, tap **Tape**. The default value is set to 1 tape.
  - For multiple tapes, tap the number on the tape field and use the keypad to enter the number of tapes.

# Printing only the date and time

Print the date and time to keep a record of when you receive incoming mail.

- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Print Mode (you may have to scroll down to see this).



- 3. Select Date and Time Stamp.
- 4. Tap Apply.
- 5. Place the envelope or envelopes on the feed deck. Depending on the SendPro C model you have, feed the envelopes manually or tap **Start** to feed the envelopes.

# Printing a test pattern


Print a test pattern to see if the printhead is working properly or if you have enough ink in the cartridge.



- 5. Examine the pattern printed on the envelope:

  - Tap Clean Printhead if the test pattern has missing or incomplete lines
    - o Once the cleaning operation completes, you must print another test pattern.
    - If this new pattern still has broken or missing lines, you may need to replace the ink cartridge or clean or replace the printhead.
    - If you see no improvement in print quality, do not repeat the cleaning, as cleaning the print nozzles consumes ink.

# Feeding envelopes

Your SendPro C Auto can automatically feed a stack of envelopes.

#### Before you begin

- All envelopes in a single stack must be the same width and thickness.
- All envelopes in a single stack must be sealed or unsealed. Mixing sealed and unsealed envelopes in a stack will cause a jam in the moistener.

#### Insert the envelopes into the feeder

- 1. Slant the stack of envelopes as shown so the bottom envelope feeds first.
- 2. Place the stack of mail on the feed deck. Place the envelopes with the flap side facing down and the top edge against the rear wall.



3. Leave about 3 mm space between the stack and the side guide so the envelopes do not drag against the guide.



4. Push the stack into the feeder until you feel resistance. The image shows how far into the feeder you need to position the stack. The side guide is pulled away to show the edge of the envelopes.



5. Set the desired moistener setting for your envelopes. In this photo "no seal" is selected.



- 6. Tap **Start** on the Envelope Printing app. The device automatically feeds the envelopes and prints the postage.
  - If you are using a stacker, extend the stacker tray so that the envelopes exit the feeder completely.
  - If you are moistening the envelope flaps, press down on the envelopes after printing to ensure the flaps are securely glued closed.



1. Tap Settings.

# Ordering ink cartridges

Use postal approved ink cartridges. Non-postal approved ink cartridges can damage your device.

If you use the AutoInk program, you will receive an ink cartridge automatically when the low ink warning appears. To enroll in the in the AutoInk program, please contact Pitney Bowes.


# Replacing the ink cartridge

Replace the ink cartridge when the low ink warning appears. This ensures your device is in optimal working condition.





# What are presets

A preset is a group of commonly-used settings that you use to quickly select the same settings in the future. Presets can store settings such as a postage class, an account and a graphic. The maximum number of presets you can create is twenty one. This includes the default preset.

Your device adds a default preset automatically once the installation is complete. You can edit the default preset to suit your own settings.

When your SendPro C Auto enters sleep mode or when you switch it off, it also reverts to the default preset.

# Adding presets

Add presets to save your most frequently used settings to use time and time again.

- · Define the settings you want to save
- · Save the preset

The maximum number of presets you can have is twenty one. This includes the default preset.


**Important:** Make sure there is nothing on the scale when you add the preset as the device will also save the weight of the mailpiece.

#### Define the settings you want to save


- 1. Tap **Envelope Printing** on the Home screen.
- 2. Make sure your scale reads zero grams.
- 3. Define the settings:
  - a. Tap **Account** then select the desired account.
  - b. Tap Class.
  - c. Tap Start Over.
  - d. Select the desired class and any additional services you may require. Tap **Apply** to continue.
  - e. Tap **Graphic** to save a logo (Envelope Message) then select the logo you want.

#### Save the preset


Tap the star in the Preset box.
 Important: You must modify something in the Envelope Printing screen for the Preset star to appear.

## Selecting a preset

## Advancing the date

Advance the date to print postage up to thirty days before you need to send it.

- 2. Tap the date. The calendar appears.
- 3. Tap **Tomorrow** or **Another Date**, depending on the date you wish to print.
- 4. When you see the future date highlighted on the calendar, tap **Apply**.
- 5. Place the envelope or envelopes on the feed deck. Depending on the SendPro C model you have, feed the envelopes manually or tap **Start** to feed the envelopes.

**Important:** The date on the postage should match the date when your mail goes to the post office. Your device automatically advances the printed date on the device stamp (as well as its internally held date) when the device time reaches 5:00 PM. You cannot change this time.

## Adjusting display brightness

Set the brightness of the display to suit your work space.

- 2. Tap **Display Brightness** in the Device & Network section of the screen.
- 3. Move the slider to adjust the brightness.


## Cleaning the printhead

If you clean the print nozzle and you still get a bad test print pattern, try cleaning the printhead.

1. Tap Settings.





# Finding the Product Code Number (PCN) and serial number

In order to find the correct information for your device, you need to know the model number.

To locate the (1) Product Code Number (PCN) and the (2) 7-digit serial number, check the label on the rear of the device or under the display cover. The serial number appears as zeros here for security reasons.





## Navigating the Home screen

The Home screen is the first screen you see after switching the device on or if you wake it from sleep mode. The Home screen provides the starting point for printing a shipping label or printing postage.

Tap the Home icon in any screen to return to the Home screen.




- **Parcel Shipping**: Tap **Parcel Shipping** to print shipping labels for important large envelopes or parcels using Royal Mail or ParcelForce.
- Envelope Printing: Tap Envelope Printing to print envelopes, post cards and small parcels.

## Navigating the Envelope Printing app

The Envelope Printing app is the starting point for printing postage on an envelope or a tape. It also allows you to change what you print.

To open the Envelope Printing app, tap **Envelope Printing**.




#### On this screen, you can:

- 1. **Weight** Tap the weight to view the weighing options. You can enter the weight manually or use a scale.


To prevent mail delays or rejections, follow Royal Mail requirements.

- Always ensure that your postal prints are clear and complete. Poor prints may result in Postal Authority being unable to offer the service you requested. Prevent mail rejections by Postal Authority by ensuring mail is legible.
